SUMMARY

Using The Work Number (TWN), an online income verification system, contributes to the department's excellent customer service and best-in-nation ranking in food assistance accuracy and quality of eligibility determinations for cash, medical assistance and child care subsidies. The costs for this service have increased an average of 20% each year for the last three years. Additionally, for Fiscal Year 2017 (FY17) the TWN contract changed and set a base number of hits for a flat monthly fee, and included an additional per hit rate for anything above that base. Costs for this service have approximately doubled since 2013 and have finally reached a level that ESA cannot meet all of its expenses without more funding. The Economic Services Administration (ESA) requests \$592,000 (\$420,000 GF-State) for the 2017-2019 Biennium for these increased costs.

PROBLEM STATEMENT

ESA must verify income to determine eligibility for programs including Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, the Aged, Blind, or Disabled programs, the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), child care subsidy programs, and the medical assistance programs jointly administered with the Washington Health Care Authority. ESA uses TWN since many employers will not verify income over the telephone or complete and return verification forms. Employers who do return the forms often provide partial information and waiting on return calls or mail delivery cause eligibility processing delays. Consequently, ESA has used TWN since 2006 and currently obtains an average of 34,925 verifications per month. Costs to use TWN have increased an average of 20% each year and have finally reached a level that ESA cannot pay for all of its expenses without more funding.

In FY17, the monthly cost will increase by approximately \$24,000 per month to \$122,667 per month. The base payment will allow ESA to access up to 460,000 billable employment and income verifications for all of FY17. If ESA exceeds 460,000 verifications, ESA will be required to pay an additional \$3.40 per check. Costs for hits above the monthly base cost are not included at this time, since it is unknown whether ESA will exceed hits covered by the base funding. If necessary, ESA will submit a 2018 supplemental request for these costs.

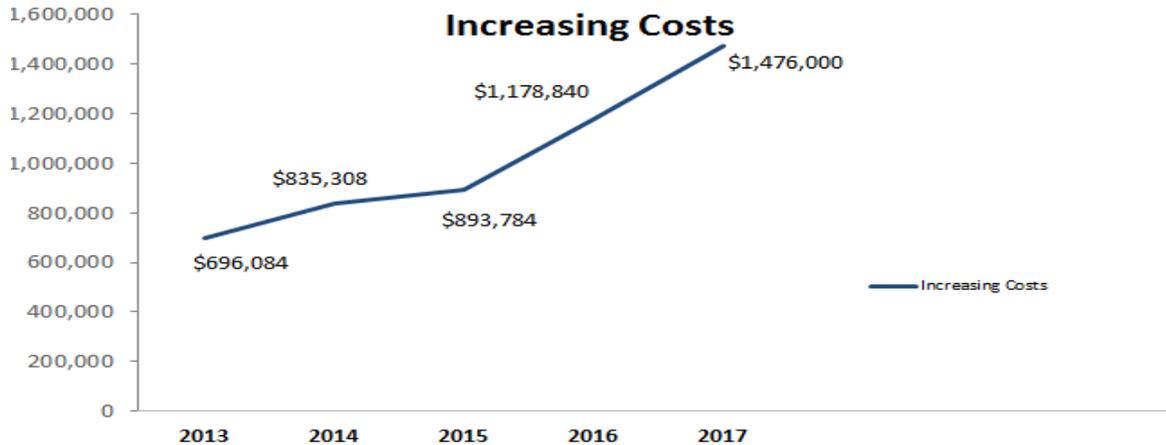

Trend in Increasing Costs Since SFY 2013

Over time ESA have covered cost increases within its appropriation through FY 2016. However, since costs have doubled in four years, ESA can no longer accommodate this increased expense in FY 2017 and beyond.

PROPOSED SOLUTION

The TWN service connects to the largest database of payroll information in the nation and currently provides a monthly average of 34,925 (approximately 419,000 annually) employment verifications to ESA workers. Access to online income verification not only benefits clients through fast and accurate eligibility processing, it benefits employers and the department by eliminating the need for paper forms and mailing or faxing documents. It also benefits taxpayers by preventing overpayments and fraud from unreported income. ESA is requesting additional funding to cover the anticipated cost increases.

EXPECTED RESULTS

By funding this request, ESA expects to continue to efficiently confirm client eligibility for the services it provides, while also maintaining funding for other critical client services.

STAKEHOLDER IMPACT

This proposal is supported by the Health Care Authority and the following DSHS areas: Aging and Long Term Services Administration, the Children’s Administration, and the Office of Fraud and Accountability. These entities rely on access to TWN to perform eligibility, anti-fraud, and other services.

There are no stakeholders known or expected to oppose this proposal.

Research with other states and providers found that the TWN service is the only data source capable of providing the high volume of instant income verifications DSHS needs to expeditiously process public assistance applications and re-certifications.
