060 - M2 - F9 - DDDS FEDERAL AUTHORITY INCREASE

Agency Submittal: 11-2017-19-YR Agency Req

Budget Period: 2017-19

SUMMARY

The Division of Disability Determination Services (DDDS) within Economic Services Administration (ESA) uses medical consultative examinations to help evaluate the eligibility of claimants. The exams are necessary to provide timely customer service. Medical examinations continue to increase in cost, making it necessary to increase the DDDS federal authority in order to spend 100 percent federal funds in this area. ESA requests \$3,809,000 GF-Federal each year to adequately adjust the DDDS federal authority to preserve customer service to those citizens filing for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI).

PROBLEM STATEMENT

DDDS uses medical evidence to determine whether a claimant is eligible for SSI or SSDI. The cost to acquire the medical evidence continues to rise. If DDDS does not provide competitive fees, there will be less medical sources doing the evaluations, and claimants will wait longer to get a determination.

PROPOSED SOLUTION

The increased federal funding authority will cover the anticipated medical increases in Fiscal Year 2017, and ensuing years. The additional authority will allow DDDS to continue scheduling consultative examinations when claimants do not have enough medical history. It will help reduce attrition from medical sources that do the examinations, and serve claimants in a timely manner.

EXPECTED RESULTS

By funding this request, DDDS will have the funding to order medical evidence that is essential in delivering customer service, in the form of an eligibility determination. This request to increase federal authority also adjusts the full authority to be more commensurate with the funding provided by The Social Security Administration.

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4. What alternatives were explored by the agency, and why was this alternative chosen?

ESA is asking to align the federal authority to be commensurate with the operating funds provided by the Social Security Administration. No other alternatives were explored.

5. How has or can the agency address the issue or need within its current appropriation level?

If DDDS were to stay within its current appropriation level, DDDS potentially would have to reduce the amount of medical evidence that is purchased in a fiscal year. This would lead to a backlog of examinations waiting to be performed, creating delays in delivering eligibility determinations to claimants. DDDS would eventually not be competitive with its fee for service, and would lose doctors who would perform the examinations. This would compound the growth of the backlog, and delay in service delivery.
