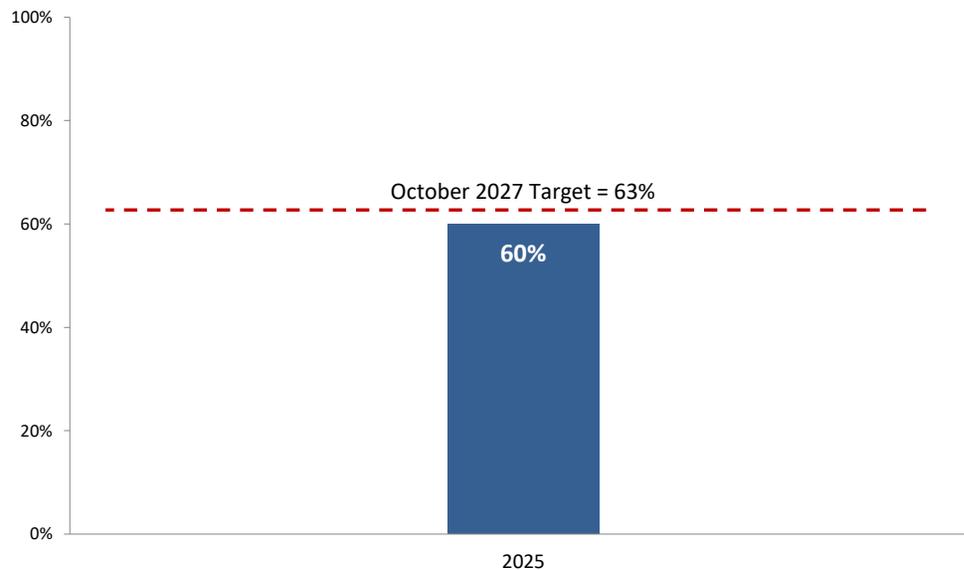

Build Economic Well-Being

Percent Positive Employee responses for Employee Survey question, "I see my work as contributing to building economic well-being."



SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS's Strategic Goal #1: Advance economic well-being by ensuring all people in Washington have their foundational needs met.
- Action Plan: Increase enterprise-wide knowledge, understanding, and use of economic well-being and the Self-Sufficiency Standard in DSHS.
- Success Measure 1.1: Increase employee responses, strongly agree/agree, from 60% October 2025 to 63% by October 2027 for Employee Survey question, "I see my work as contributing to building economic well-being."
- Importance: OOS recognizes that having employees understand and feel that their work contributes to advancing economic well-being is essential for every DSHS administration to maximize their contributions to state poverty reduction and economic well-being goals.

MEASURE DEFINITION: Percent positive staff responses to DSHS Employee Survey question "I see my work as contributing to building economic well-being."

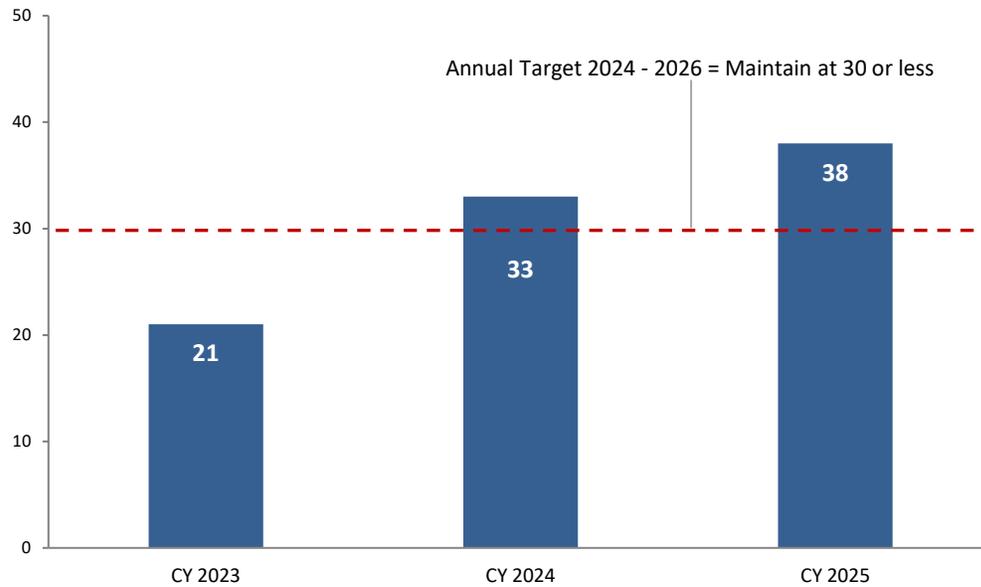

SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS's Strategic Goal #2: Advance innovation in service delivery to amplify impact, ensure compliance and increase effectiveness.
- Action Plan: Ensure effective service delivery through strategic leadership, expert consultation, and streamlined processes—targeting confidentiality, fraud prevention, and accountability.
- Success Measure: 2.2: Maintain the number of confidentiality breaches to 30 or less each calendar year for years 2025, 2026, 2027.
- Importance: OOS recognizes the importance of maintaining confidentiality.

DATA SOURCE: The Privacy Breach Application (PBA) which is hosted by the DSHS Privacy Officer; supplied by Brian Peyton, DSHS Privacy Officer, OOS/OIG.

MEASURE DEFINITION: The number of health information confidentiality breaches required to be reported to the Office for Civil Rights (OCR) in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

DATA NOTES: **1** The DSHS Privacy Officer will provide quarterly updates, though data will not generally be mature for two months after the end of the quarter. **2** This measure only includes data breaches that are considered reportable under HIPAA. This is the number of breaches per quarter/ year, not the number of client records released. *Click link below for additional data notes.*

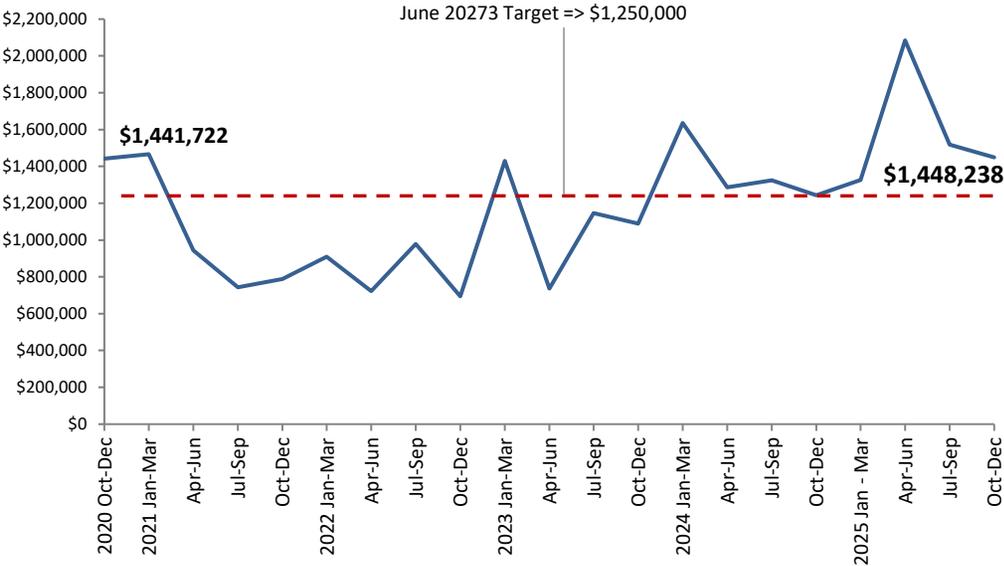

SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS's Strategic Goal #2: Advance innovation in service delivery to amplify impact, ensure compliance and increase effectiveness.
- Success Measure 2.3: Increase the dollar amount of identified overpayments per quarter from \$950,000 to \$1,250,000 by fiscal year 2027.
- Action Plan: Ensure effective service delivery through strategic leadership, expert consultation, and streamlined processes—targeting confidentiality, fraud prevention, and accountability.
- Importance: OFA has continued to increase overpayments since pandemic lows during SFY 2021-2022, while total number of referrals to OFA continue to be consistent.
- Data does not include overpayments written by DCYF or ESA.

MEASURE DEFINITION: The amount of overpayments issued each quarter based upon the investigations conducted by Office of Fraud & Accountability.
DATA NOTES: 1 Overpayments are identified dollars not recovered dollars. 2 Data does not include overpayments written by DCYF or ESA.

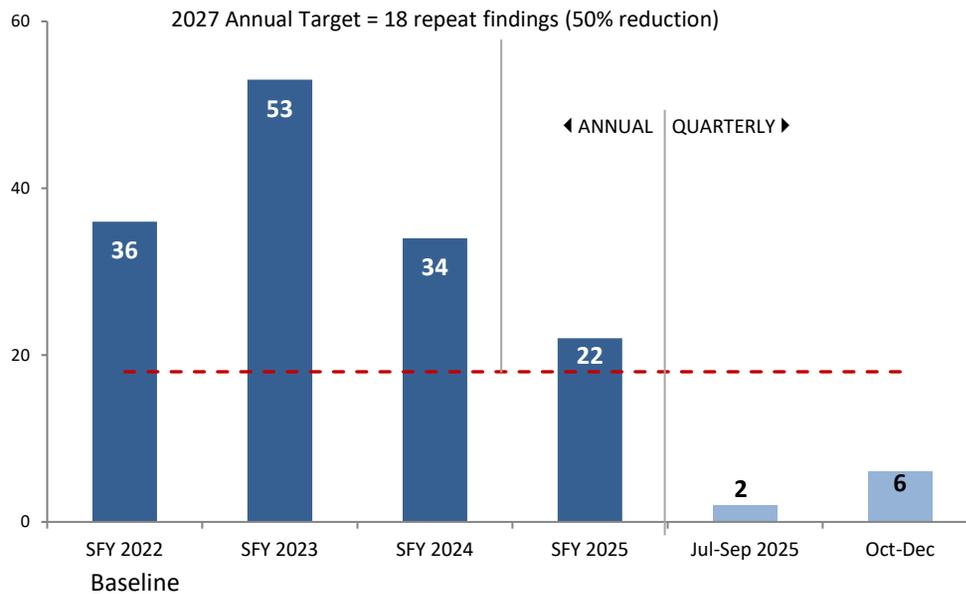

Safety and Health Assessment findings

SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS's Strategic Goal #2: Advance innovation in service delivery to amplify impact, ensure compliance and increase effectiveness.
- Action Plan: Advance organizational compliance by investing in technology to modernize audit and risk systems.
- Success Measure: 2.5 Enterprise Risk Management Office will achieve a 50% reduction in repeat Safety and Health Assessment findings by July 2027.
- Importance: This measure provides an indication of DSHS commitment to safety. Proactive measures for safety are an important part of DSHS' commitment to government accountability, as well as its commitment to being a workplace of choice.
- In the last three years the trend has been neutral. 2023 saw a nearly 50% increase from the 2022 baseline with a substantial decrease in 2024 to just below the 2022 baseline.

DATA SOURCE: ERMO Safety Office SHPA reports; supplied by Jason York.

MEASURE DEFINITION: Number of repeat findings on Safety and Health Performance Assessments. A "repeat finding" is a finding that was identified on the previous year's Assessment.

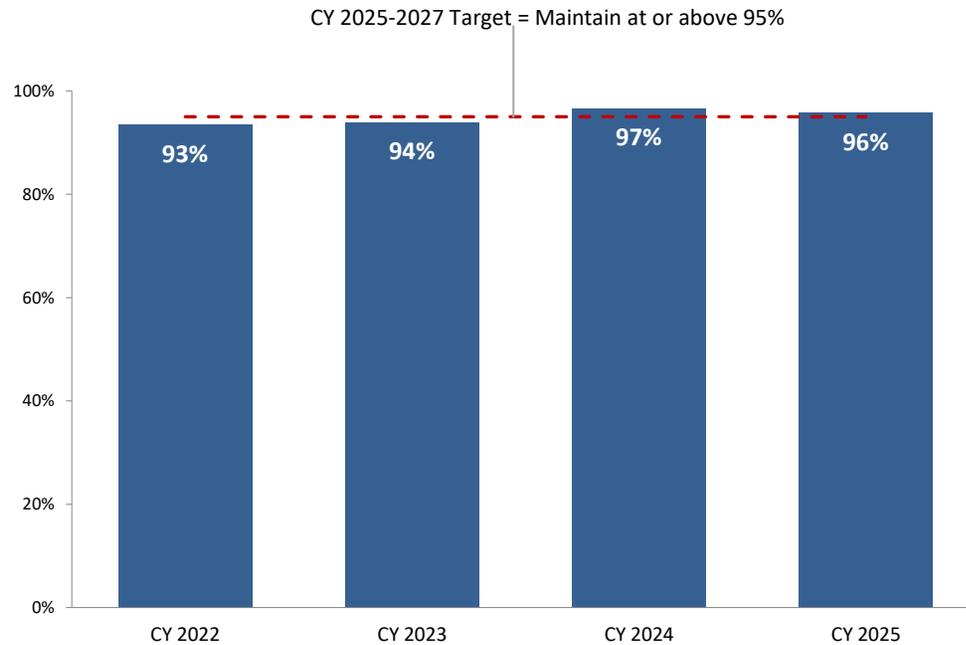
DATA NOTES: 1 Percent of reduction of repeat findings is calculated from baseline of 36 repeat findings in SFY 2022.

Timeliness of five-day letters in response to public records requests



SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS's Strategic Goal #4: Enhance customer experience by fostering collaboration and partnership.
- Action Plan: Amplify DSHS customer experience by investing in communication processes and strategies—targeting DSHS policies, patient rights, and public disclosure.
- Success Measure 4.2: Office of Information Governance will maintain the number of 5-day letters sent on time at 95% or more by July 2027.
- Importance: This measure provides an indication of the promptness of DSHS responses to public records requests. Efficient, prompt responses to public records requests are an important part of DSHS' commitment to government accountability and transparency, as well as its commitment to quality customer service.

DATA SOURCE: ARRTS (Agency Records Request Tracking System) report; pulled by Chris Petcher, ITS 5 Developer.

MEASURE DEFINITION: Percent of letters sent within five days of public records request.

DATA NOTES: 1 Cut off date is four working days before end of quarter. 2 The start date for next report is four working days prior to start of quarter.

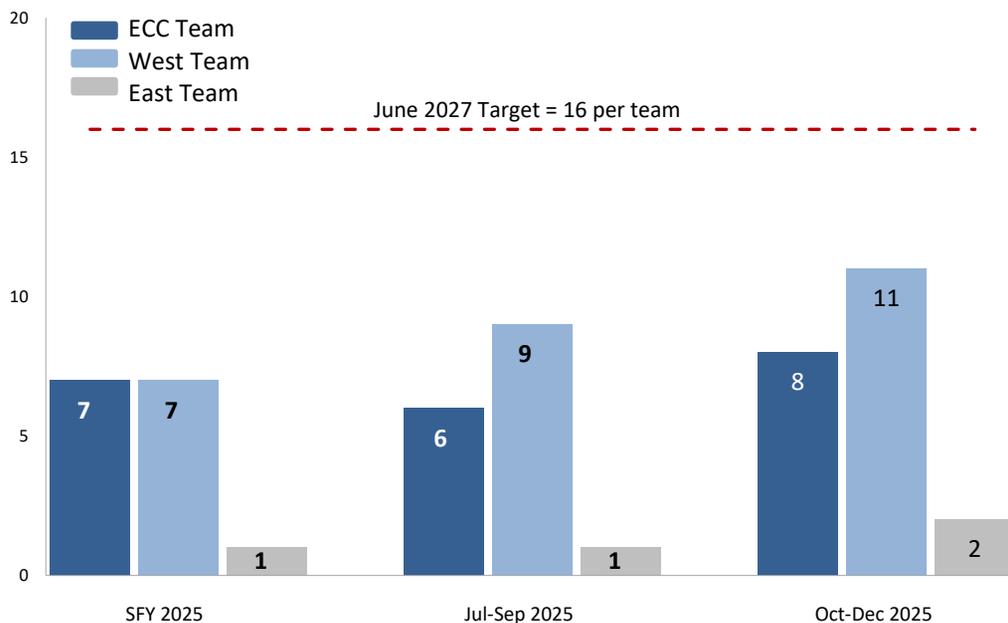

- Success Measure: 3.1: Office of Emergency Management will staff, train, and resource three incident management teams by June 2027.
- Importance: OOS recognizes the importance of employees emergency preparedness preparation.

MEASURE DEFINITION: Measurement is based on the Emergency Coordination Center, West, and East teams each achieving the minimum training standard for 16 members to successfully complete ICS position-specific training certification.

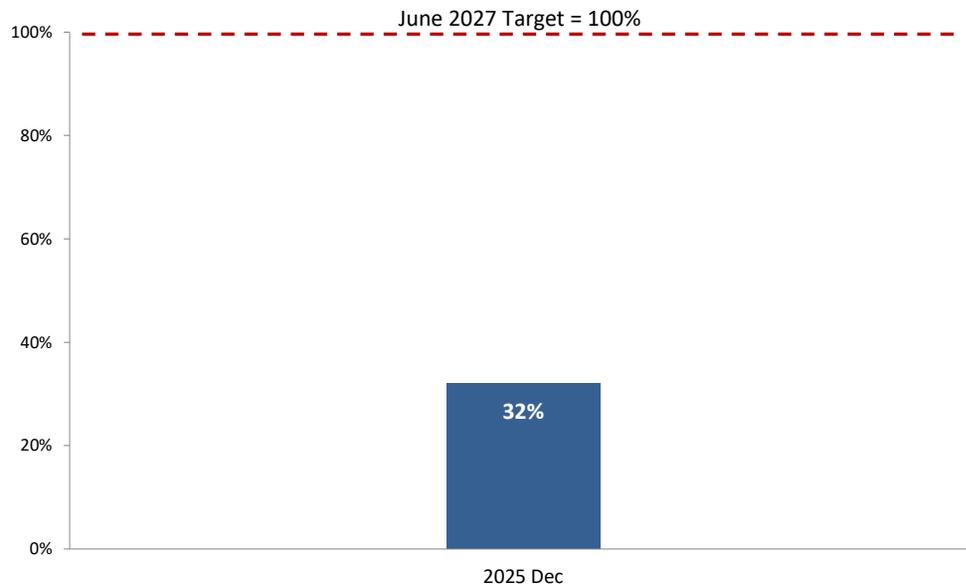

SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS Strategic Goal #3: Strengthen organizational resilience by cultivating a skilled, adaptable, and supported workforce.
- Action Plan: Support a skilled workforce by providing ongoing education for staff working with Tribes and Urban Indian Organizations.
- Success Measure: 3.3: Office of Indian Policy will provide DSHS Administrative Policy 7.01 Training to 100% of new and existing staff working with tribes through June 30, 2027.

DATA SOURCE: Learning Center; supplied by Janelle Reanier-Briggs.

MEASURE DEFINITION: The quarterly percent of current staff required to take DSHS Administrative Policy 7.01 Training, who have completed the training.

DATA NOTES: 1 The number of DSHS employees required to take 7.01 training is the denominator. The number of DSHS employees in compliance with the training requirements is the numerator. 2 The count for each quarter is determined on the last day of the quarter.

SUMMARY

This measure supports OOS Strategic Goal #3: Strengthen organizational resilience by cultivating a skilled, adaptable, and supported workforce.

Action Plan: Empower supervisors and staff through customer-focused Human Resource services that offer innovative tools, clear communication, and targeted training.

Success Measure 3.5a: Human Resources Division will maintain traffic at 20% or greater on the customer-facing HR SharePoint site with quality site visits averaging at least 2 minutes by June 2027.

Importance: This measure tells us whether employees are actively visiting the HR SharePoint site as a trusted, go to place for information, tools, and support. While HRD also provides consultation and direct guidance, the site serves as a central platform for sharing consistent, accessible resources. Sustained traffic signals that staff continue to find value in the content, which means HR is successfully equipping our workforce with the information and support they need.

DDATA SOURCE: Site usage feature on the HRD SharePoint; supplied by Lindsey White.

MEASURE DEFINITION: The percent of unique viewers divided by the total number of employees.

SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS Strategic Goal #3: Strengthen organizational resilience by cultivating a skilled, adaptable, and supported workforce.
- Action Plan: Empower supervisors and staff through customer-focused Human Resource services that offer innovative tools, clear communication, and targeted training.
- Success Measure 3.5: Human Resources Division will maintain traffic at 20% or greater on the customer-facing HR SharePoint site with quality site visits averaging at least 2 minutes by June 2027.
- Importance: This measure tells us whether employees are meaningfully engaging with the HR SharePoint site once they arrive. Longer visits suggest that employees are exploring content, using tools, and engaging with resources in ways that support their needs. This signals that HR is effectively equipping the workforce with helpful, relevant information.

DATA SOURCE: Site usage feature on the HRD SharePoint; supplied by Lindsey White.

MEASURE DEFINITION: Average site visit time to the Human Resources Division SharePoint site.

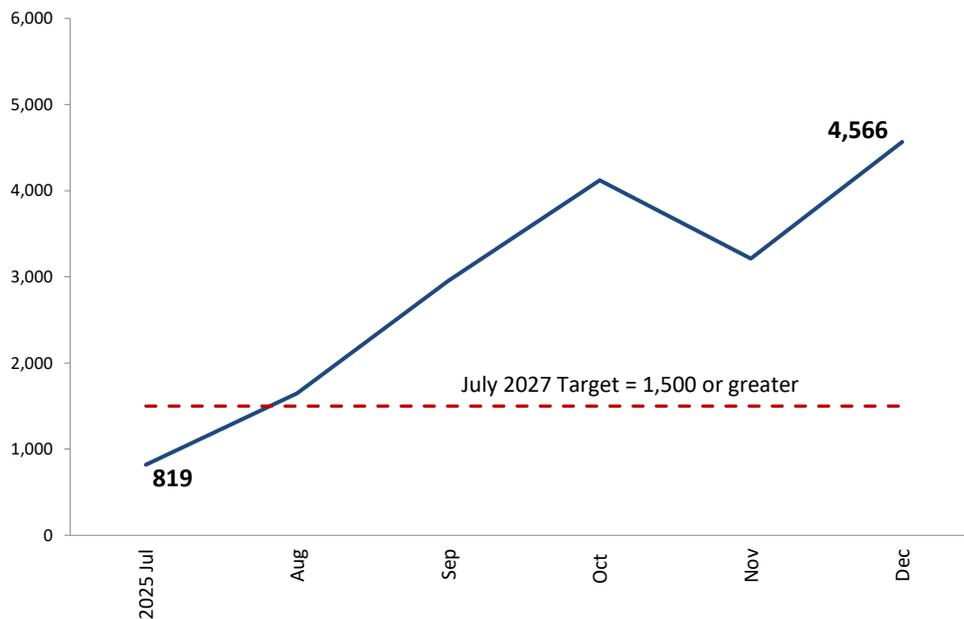

SUMMARY

- This measure supports OOS's Strategic Goal #4: Enhance customer experience by fostering collaboration and partnership.
- Action Plan: Foster collaboration with internal and external partners by delivering timely, high-quality communication about DSHS programs and services.
- Success Measure 4.4: Office of Communications and Government Affairs will increase monthly Facebook and Instagram content interactions by 4.5%, from 1,435 (six-month average January-June 2025) to 1,500 by July 2027.
- Importance: This measure provides an emphasis on DSHS commitment to leveraging data-driven strategies to reach a broader audience. Measures for tracking progress and refining engagement strategies are an important part of DSHS' commitment to government accountability and transparency, as well as commitment to quality customer service.

DATA SOURCE: Office of Communications Reports to OOS; Data will be supplied by the Social Media Manager. Data is gathered from the native platforms monthly. (Facebook and Instagram).

MEASURE DEFINITION: This measure tracks the number of interactions (individuals who have chosen to subscribe, like, or follow an account) on Facebook and Instagram. It involves monitoring changes in the follower count over time to understand the account's growth, reach, and the effectiveness of its content strategy. This measurement helps determine how well the account is attracting and retaining an audience, offering insights into the account's visibility, influence, and overall impact on each social platform.+

DATA NOTES: 1 Baseline is 1,435, the six-month average January-June 2025.
