During the refreshments, people started to introduce themselves to each other. They could recognize some of the behaviors of their loved ones as they were watching the video and were more understanding.

The April meeting was the big breakthrough. We used the

University of Alabama's *Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia* booklets we received in March from the SDCP support program. The pictures were so clear we could literally see the 'lights go on' in the family members' minds.

At the end of this meeting, people were more open with each other. They introduced themselves and then poured out their hearts. There were feelings of guilt and inadequacy, and some tears, but most of all there was a feeling of camaraderie. One of them summed it up by saying "I feel that we are a real family now."

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Six family members attended.
