
If you have a Washington photo ID and any documentation showing that you participate in any of the programs below, you are eligible to receive the discounted admission or membership.


**Discounted Membership:** An annual household membership for \$40. This household membership covers 2 named adults and all legal dependents ages 3-18. Children 2 and under are always free.


