The pass is for entry to the Seattle Aquarium during regular hours of operation. You will need to present a valid, legal form of ID and the Kinship

Navigator card.

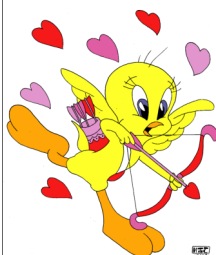
We would also like to remind you that we do offer transportations for Ferndale & Lummi Students who have missed their bus only if there is no other transportation available.

15th Annual Voices of Children Contest 2018

The Family Education & Support Services, Washington State Department of Social & Health Services, Area Agency on Aging and TwinStar Credit Union are having their 15th annual Voices of Children Contest for 2018.

This is our chance to let our youth get their voices heard about their experiences of living with a relative in a positive way.

What is the Contest?

Voices of Children Raised by Grandparents and Other Relatives is a contest for children in Washington State who are being raised, now or in the past, by a relative other than their parents. The contest honors both the children and the more than 45, 000 grandparents and other relatives in Washington State who are raising them.

How do you enter the contest?

- Write a poem or short essay, or draw a picture that describes how living with a relative (such as a grandparent, aunt or uncle) has made a positive difference in your life.
- Mail entries to: Voices of Children Contest, 1202 Black Lake Blvd. #B, Olympia, WA 98502.
- All entries must be submitted or postmarked by April 2, 2018.**

What are the rules?

- All participating children must live in **Washington State** and be **5-19 years old**
- Entries will be judged in three age categories: ages 5-7, ages 8-12, ages 13-19
- Poems should be 21 lines or less
- Essays should be 200 words or less
- Make your art as **big and bold** as possible and add a statement that explains your drawing

-Artwork must be submitted on the entry form

- Do not include any names within artwork
- Artwork must be flat and within the box on entry form
- Entry must be original, in English, and **unpublished**
- Winners will be notified in early May and all decisions of the final judges are final
- Award ceremony for winners will be held at the Governor's Mansion in Olympia
- We reserve the right of first publication and use of writings and drawings
- All entries may be published in a 2018 book called Voices of Children-Raised by Grandparents and Other Relatives

What are the prizes?

The top two entries in each age category will receive: **\$100.00 from TwinStar Credit Union**

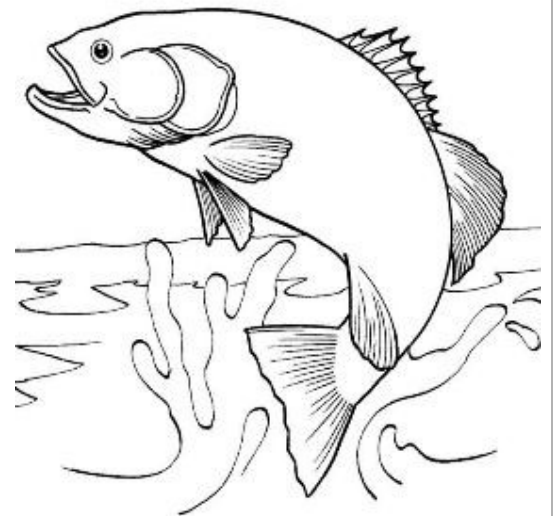
