Discussed changes to meeting which include adding invited work group members to agenda.

- For the requirements met in federal regulations, Appendix Z provides explanation for those regulations.
- One of the requirements not in SHB 1218 that the department is considering is requiring two weeks of emergency provisions. Emergency provisions could include food, water, first aid supplies, hygiene supplies, and medications. The work group noted the difficulty in acquiring surplus of some of these items as well as potential costs. This is an area where an economic impact analysis will be needed.
