- RCS staff asked for feedback on work group process so far. In terms of content, format, and time of meetings, the work group stated they liked the meeting structure and that breaking down the rule text into smaller pieces is helpful.
- Now that the work group is wrapping up the rule recommendations for the communications sections of SHB1218, the next topic to explore are the sections related to visitation and essential support persons (SHB 1218 sections 6 and 20).
- In open conversation about visitation and essential support persons, the work group suggested looking at most recent safe start plans, current bills from other states on this topic, and Federal CMS rules for research to bring to the work group for consideration in developing rule recommendations.
- Some of the concerns from COVID-19 that led to the visitation issues include impacts to residents from prolonged isolation, recurring changes to guidance, and communicating information.
- RCS staff will conduct further research into the above issues
