CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL (CDC) RECOMMENDED GUIDANCE
FOR WATER MANAGEMENT PLANS

Dear Assisted Living Facility Administrator:

Legionella, the bacterium that causes a type of serious lung infection known as Legionnaires' disease, grows best in building water systems that are not well maintained. Some water systems in buildings have a higher risk for Legionella growth and spread than others. While creation of a water management plan is not required in long-term care facilities, the CDC is recommending all long-term care facilities have water management plans to reduce the likelihood of a Legionella outbreak.

The CDC has outlined ideas and created toolkits facilities may use to create an effective water management plan and reduce potential Legionella growth.
