## ALF #2025-022 CR-101 FILED TO PROPOSE AMENDING AND ADDING SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 388-78A WAC, ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY LICENSING RULES

Dear Assisted Living Facility Administrator:

The Department of Social and Health Services (department) is considering amending and adding sections of Chapter 388-78A WAC, Assisted Living Facility (ALF) Licensing Rules. The purpose of this rulemaking is directly related to <u>Engrossed Second Substitute Senate Bill 5337</u> which establishes a certification for ALFs operating as a memory care facility or a memory care unit. The rule writing will address the application process for certification, physical environment requirements, a separate disclosure for staffing levels, care and services requirements, disaster preparedness, and enforcement action for operating without a certification.

These changes are:

- Required by state law; and
- Necessary to protect public health, safety and welfare

The department filed a CR-101 (a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry and the first step in the rulemaking process to develop/change a rule) with the Office of the Code Reviser on May 27, 2025, to begin the rulemaking process. The notice will be published in the Washington State Register (WSR) under <u>WSR 25-12-025</u>. This CR-101 and related rulemaking information will be available on the Residential Care Services rulemaking webpage <u>ALTSA RCS Rulemaking</u> as the rulemaking progresses.
