ALTSA: CCRSS #2021-020 EMPLOYER RESPONSIBILITES FOR RESPIRATORY PROTECTION PROGRAM AND PROVISION OF PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

Dear Provider:

On March 30, 2021, the Washington State Department of Labor & Industries (L&I) and Department of Health (DOH) issued a guidance entitled *L&I and DOH Respirator and PPE for In-Home Care Agencies: Employer Responsibilities for Respiratory Protection Program and Provision of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).* This guidance provides information for inhome care agency healthcare workers (HCWs) and employers on when to use certain types of PPE, and what to do if your agency cannot obtain the recommended PPE.

Below is a brief summary of the content of the guidance. However, you must read the entire guidance to be fully informed of the all the requirements that apply to your agency (click <u>here</u>).

- 1. In-home care agencies are required to develop and maintain a Respiratory Protection Program under WAC 296-842-12005.
- 2. **In-home care agencies are required to provide initial fit-tests** for each HCW with the same model, style, and size respirator that the HCW will be required to wear for protection against COVID-19 and other airborne hazards.
- 3. In-home care agencies are required to provide fit tested respirators (N95, elastomeric or PAPR) to all HCWs with the potential to have contact with patients/clients with known or suspected COVID-19:
- 4. **In-home care agencies are required to provide source control** to all staff who are providing care to patients/clients, or whose work requires them to be within six feet of another person (e.g., HCWs, patients/clients, other people in the home, etc.), even if not required to wear PPE as described elsewhere in this document. Patients/clients should not wear source control if contraindicated.
- 5. **In-home care agencies are required to provide gowns, gloves, and eye protection** to staff who are entering patient/clients homes. Gowns and gloves should be used according to standard precautions.
