ALTSA: CCRSS #2024-014 EMERGENCY RULES VICES-GENERAL AND WAC

(CR-103E) AMENDING WAC 388-101D-0295 MEDICATION SERVICES-GENERAL AND WAC 388-101D-0330 STORAGE OF MEDICATIONS

Dear Certified Community Residential Services and Supports Provider:

Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA) filed emergency rules under <u>WSR 24-05-004</u> amending sections of WAC 388-101D-0295 Medication Services-General and WAC 388-101D-0295 Storage of medication. (DDA) is enacting these amendments on an emergency to ensure that when a client requires a medication for which there is a prescription but no pharmacist-prepared label, the medication is labeled in a way that promotes safety.

The emergency rule:

- Is effective February 8, 2024.
- Amends WAC 388-101D-0295 to clarify that before providing medication assistance or medication administration to a client the service provider must have a legible pharmacistprepared label or manufacturer's label with the name of the client for whom the medication is prescribed added to the container.
- Amends WAC 388-101D-0330 to clarify that the service provider must store medications in the original medication container with a pharmacist-prepared label, a manufacturer's label in accordance with WAC 388-101D-0295, or in a medication organizer clearly labeled with each medication, medication dose and frequency to be given, and route each medication is to be administered.
- NOTE: If a client is using a medication organizer, requirements in WAC 388-101D-0335 must still be adhered to; this WAC remains unchanged.
- Amends other parts of the section for clarity and readability.
- · Other sections are unchanged.
