QSO-21-15-ALL UPDATED GUIDANCE FOR EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS - APPENDIX Z
OF THE STATE OPERATIONS MANUAL

Dear Nursing Facility/Home or ICF/IID Administrator:

On June 3, 2017, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) published Appendix Z of the State Operations Manual (SOM), which provides guidance to all surveyors for the 17 providers and supplier types affected by the Emergency Preparedness rules. In February 2019, CMS added emerging infectious diseases to the definition of all-hazards approach. In September 2019, CMS published two final rules that were effective November 29, 2019.

In light of the COVID-19 public health emergency and the updated rules, with QSO-21-15-ALL, CMS announced revisions to Appendix Z, and expanded the Interpretive Guidelines to incorporate lessons learned from the public health emergency and the new rules. The changes to Appendix Z are at the bottom of the QSO memo. As of this letter, CMS had not yet updated Appendix Z at their website.

The revised guidance is primarily a result of burden reduction rules, and adjusts cycles of updates, and changes to the training and testing requirements. CMS also updated many other requirements that listed in the QSO memo and the attached Appendix Z document.
