Dear Provider / Administrator:

The Department of Social and Health Services has filed <u>CR-103E (WSR 20-24-060)</u> emergency rules for tuberculosis (TB) testing requirements for long-term care workers. The new emergency rules continue the suspension of requirements related to TB testing in WACs 388-76-10265, -10285, and -10290(1). These rules are suspended in response to the significant threat of COVID-19 to our most vulnerable populations, especially for those receiving long-term care services in their homes and congregate settings, such as long-term care facilities.

Clinics providing TB testing continue to be short of staff and have limited availability throughout the state due to the COVID-19 outbreak. These clinics are unable to provide the TB testing required as a part of the hiring process in many long-term care programs. These emergency rules are intended to help meet the demand for long-term care workers in Washington State.

Additionally, a <u>CR-101 (WSR 20-16-069)</u> was filed with Office of the Code Reviser on July 29, 2020 to begin the rule-making process establishing a timeframe when long-term care facility employees and residential service and support provider employees were not required to be screened for tuberculosis under the rules suspended or waived during the COVID-19 pandemic.
