Dear Administrator / Provider / Superintendent:

Recently the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) announced updates to several COVID-19 vaccination web pages including information about the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine. The CDC also published the new Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine web page, and announced the new V-safe After Vaccination Health Checker. Additionally, the Department of Health has created an online tool called Phase Finder to help people find out if they are eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine in Washington State. The following may be useful information related to the COVID-19 vaccine:

- The <u>COVID-19 vaccination web page for healthcare professionals</u> directs healthcare professionals to clinical information including Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommendations, storage and handling information, and vaccination provider requirements and support.
- The <u>Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine CDC web page</u> has information specific to Moderna's vaccine, including resources to assist providers including a Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine FAQs and a link to the ACIP's clinical recommendations.
- The <u>Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine web page</u> has information specific to Pfizer's vaccine, including resources to assist providers in storing, handling, and administering the vaccine. The online information includes the ACIP's clinical recommendations. - The CDC recently announced the <u>V-safe After Vaccination Health Checker</u>. V-safe is smartphone-based tool that uses text messaging and web surveys to provide personalized health check-ins after receiving a COVID-19 vaccine. The web page provides a link to register and registration instructions.
- The Department of Health has announced <u>Phase Finder</u>, an online tool designed to help people in Washington find out if they are eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine, and if not, sign up to be notified when they become eligible. The tool asks a series of questions related to the four phases of vaccine distribution to inform eligibility. The web page includes links to the Phase Finder, vaccine locations, and an FAQs.
- Follow these links to find updated CDC COVID-19 vaccine information for consumers, including:
 - What to expect at your vaccination appointment
 - What to expect after getting vaccinated
 - o Post-vaccination considerations for healthcare personnel
 - Post-vaccination considerations for long-term care residents
