ALTSA: NH #2020-072 QSO-21-02-NH COMPLIANCE WITH RESIDENTS' RIGHTS REQUIREMENT RELATED TO NURSING HOME RESIDENTS' RIGHT TO VOTE

Dear Nursing Facility/Home Administrator:

Due to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and the governor restricted visitation to nursing homes. On October 5, 2020, CMS issued QSO-21-02-NH, regarding nursing home residents' right to vote.

Under federal resident rights regulations at 42 CFR §483.10 and state rules at WAC 388-97-1080, nursing home residents have the right to exercise their rights as a citizen, and the nursing facility has the responsibility to support or promote those rights.

CMS strongly encourages nursing homes to have a plan to ensure residents can exercise their right to vote, whether in-person, absentee or mail-in, or other authorized process.

If a home is considering using people outside the facility to come into the facility to assist with the polling process, the facility should follow the Safe Start for Long Term Care guidelines. Whether or not external assistance is used, nursing homes are required to support a resident in the exercise of their right (§483.10(b)(2)) to vote, such as assisting with absentee or mail-in voting, or transporting residents to polling locations or ballot drop-boxes in a safe manner.

Nursing home residents or their representatives who believe their rights under these regulations have been violated can file a complaint with the Residential Care Services Complaint Resolution Unit at 800-562-6078 or https://www.dshs.wa.gov/altsa/residential-care-services/residentialcare-services-online-incident-reporting.

Allegations of voter coercion or intimidation may be referred to the Department of Justice for filing voting complaints with the Civil Rights Division by calling 800-253-3931, emailing voting.section@usdoj.gov or by submitting an online form.
