ALTSA: NH #2021-030 CR-103E FILED TO EXTEND EMERGENCY RULE AMENDING NURSING HOME REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO PHYSICIAN SERVICES

Dear Nursing Facility/Home Administrator:

Residential Care Services (RCS) filed an emergency rule (<u>WSR 20-10-034</u>) effective April 29, 2020, related to WAC 388-97-1260 and physician services. The rule was amended in response to the significant threat of COVID-19. The rule was extended on August 26, 2020 (<u>WSR 20-18-022</u>), and extended again on December 24, 2020 (WSR <u>21-01-192</u>).

On April 21, 2021, RCS filed a CR-103E (WSR <u>21-09-061</u>) to extend the amended rule for a third time. The rule expires on August 17, 2021.

WAC 388-97-1260 was amended to permit the physician to delegate tasks to a registered nurse practitioner or a physician assistant, even if it is required to be performed by the physician in regulation and regardless of the frequency of the delegation. The amendment does not change the required frequency of physician/delegate visits, or the requirement for the physician to supervise the delegate. The delegate must only perform tasks within the scope of practice of their credential.

The adoption of the emergency rule helps to align the state rule with rules the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has waived or amended in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Additionally, RCS filed a CR-101 (<u>WSR 20-17-133</u>) on August 18, 2020 to begin permanent rule making on WAC 388-97-1260 and other related rules.
