What are Organizational Change Management (OCM) and Readiness?

OCM is the people side of change. Resistance is a natural human reaction to change and the role of OCM is to help people understand the change and be prepared. Using OCM tools and methods on a project increases the likelihood of a successful transition.

Readiness is about working with staff and stakeholders to identify the impacts of the change, create plans to address the impacts, and gather data. Readiness activities use tools to measure how informed and primed people are for the change. Readiness activities include communication and training for staff, stakeholders, and tribes as needed. Another important readiness activity is constructing transition plans, which detail out the work needed to achieve the business process changes. An example of readiness data is measuring how much providers, consumers and staff know about the CDE implementation.
