

Consumer Directed Employer (CDE) Project Talking Points #19 – Living situation and Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) exemptions

How does an Individual Provider's (IP) living situation determine how work is claimed?

IP who does NOT live with the client they serve will:

- Use the CDE's Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) system to record the start time and end time for every shift
- Use the CDE's EVV system to record the location where care begins and ends (Note: if care begins or ends in the community, this location is not recorded)

IP who DOES live with a client they serve will:

- Record their total hours by day(s) worked
- Not record a location for these hours worked
- Submit timesheets weekly

IP who provides service to a client they live with AND another client will:

- Report hours according to the living situation with each client
