



**Consumer Directed Employer (CDE) Project
Talking Points #7 – CC&S Determination**

What is a Character, Competence, and Suitability (CC&S) determination?

A CC&S determination is a review process that is used, when needed, to decide whether an otherwise qualified IP may work with a client. Currently, DSHS/AAA regional staff complete CC&S determinations.

A CC&S determination is required when the IP receives a “Review Required” letter following a background check. This letter indicates that although there were no disqualifying crimes, there were records that require review.

In addition, some other reasons a CC&S review may be conducted include:

- ✓ Determining whether the IP can safely take on caring for another client
- ✓ Considering employment or personal responsibilities that may interfere with providing reliable service
- ✓ Reviewing travel considerations that may impact ability to arrive on time to provide care
- ✓ Any other concerns about health and safety or the ability to provide needed care

How will the CC&S determination work with the CDE?

The CDE will have primary responsibility for CC&S determinations. Case managers, as well as clients and IPs can provide information to the CDE for consideration. The CDE will consider information provided by the case manager when making a determination and must not allow a particular IP to work with a client if it is determined that the health, safety, or well-being of the client is in jeopardy.
