Students can use the scholarships at public colleges and many independent colleges in Washington.

Important reminder: Students who experienced foster care or unaccompanied homelessness may qualify for the Passport to Careers program and can choose to attend college or participate in an apprenticeship program. Students will also likely qualify for the Washington College Grant, the College Bound Scholarship, and Education and Training Voucher (ETV) Programs.
