TYPE 1 DIABETES

What is Type 1 Diabetes (T1D)?

According to the <u>Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u>, "If you have type 1 diabetes, your pancreas doesn't make insulin or makes very little insulin. Insulin helps blood sugar enter the cells in your body for use as energy. Without insulin, blood sugar can't get into cells and builds up in the bloodstream. High blood sugar is damaging to the body and causes many of the symptoms and complications of diabetes. Type 1 diabetes was once called insulin-dependent or juvenile diabetes, but it can develop at any age."
