ADVANCED HOME CARE AIDE SPECIALIST PILOT

A new training pilot designed for Home Care Aides working with individuals with high or complex needs.

DSHS 22-1664 (Rev. 8/17)

The AHCAS training focuses on developing new skills to provide specialized support as defined by an individual's support plan.

The goal of the pilot is to improve health, provide behavioral supports, and assist people to maintain and/or attain the highest quality of life while receiving in-home services.

Provider requirements and information

- Currently certified as a Home Care Aide or equivalent
- Currently providing in-home services to an eligible person
- Completion of a paid AHCAS 70 hour training delivered over 8 weeks with 35 hours in a class setting and 35 hours completed online
- Must have 600 or more cumulative career hours
- AHCAS providers will receive a \$0.50 hourly payment differential.
