





NUMBER OF PEOPLE SERVED IN FY21



Our OFMHS team also conducts competency evaluations of clients in jails, and provides restoration services to patients in our competency restoration programs.





Our capacity and occupancy rates


It is common for there to be a difference between the number of funded beds and the average occupancy rates due to patients discharging from BHA facilities, maintenance and renovations, and other standard operations. However, the COVID-19 pandemic contributed significantly to this gap in 2021, as additional infection control protocols required social distancing measures such as single-occupancy rooms and the establishment of quarantine and isolation wards.
