CSTC stands as Washington state's sole state-operated and funded psychiatric hospital caring for children and youth aged 5 to 17. Situated in Lakewood, WA, our campus offers a 65-bed capacity facility and more than 180 staff providing a secure haven for young people with complex psychological and safety needs that extend beyond their community's resources.

### **Tailored Programs for Diverse Needs**

At CSTC, we've structured our facility into four distinct cottages, each designed to meet specific age and developmental requirements:

- Camano Cottage: Caring for children aged 6 to 11.
- Ketron Cottage: Serving children aged 12 to 14.
- Orcas Cottage: Focusing on youths aged 14 to 18.
- San Juan Cottage: Designed for forensic and civilly-committed youths, aged 14 to 18.



### Holistic Treatment Approach

Our comprehensive therapy program encompasses a range of therapeutic options, including individual, family, and group therapies, as well as recreational activities. Each young person under our care benefits from a personalized treatment plan crafted by a skilled multidisciplinary team, featuring psychologists, psychiatrists, social workers, nurses, recreational therapists, and psychiatric child care counselors. Families and guardians play a vital role in the process, participating in a weekly dialectical behavioral therapy skills group and a quarterly multiday retreat, ensuring that both youths and their caregivers acquire new skills to ensure success upon reintegration into their communities.

### **Patient Demographics**

As of December 2022, our patient population numbered 81, with 57% aged between 13 and 17, and 43% between 6 and 12. Ethnic diversity was represented by 37% Black, 25% Hispanic, 15% Native American, and 31% White Non-Hispanic patients.

The percentages may not add to 100% as some clients identified as more than one race/ethnicity.

### Impact and Reach

In fiscal year 2022, we served 81 patients; we admitted 47 patients and discharged 42. The average length of stay is 10 to 12 months. Our fiscal year 2022 operating budget stood at \$20,020,700, underscoring our commitment to delivering exceptional care and assistance to the young individuals entrusted to our center.



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### **Treatment & Programming**

- **Treatment Goals**: Enhance functioning, reduce symptoms, support healthy development, and foster long-term success.
- Cottage Programming: Integrating evidence-based practices for effective care, including:
  - Cognitive behavioral therapy
  - Exposure and response prevention
  - Trauma focused-CBT
  - Family therapy



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• **Professional Trainees Program:** Partnerships with local universities offer training in psychiatry, psychology, social work, nursing, and more, enhancing CSTC's clinical programming and staff recruitment.

### **Recreational Therapy & Programming**



- **Recreational Therapy:** Aims to help patients achieve goals through social skills, fitness, and independent living skills. Initiatives:
  - New fitness program for each cottage (2x/week)
  - Expressive arts integration (poetry)
  - Adventure therapy expansion (camping, backpacking, family trips)

### Staff & Patient Safety

- Enhanced Training:
  - Nonviolent Crisis Intervention® 2nd Edition with Advanced Physical Skills (3-day training)
  - Dialectical behavioral therapy for direct care staff
  - Advanced crisis intervention training for crisis prediction, prevention, and de-escalation

### **Facility Improvements**

- Seclusion room upgrade: Oak Grove Elementary School
- Ligature reduction: Enhancing safety in cottage common areas
- Low stimulation areas: Expanding and improving at Ketron and Orcas cottages
- New multi-purpose facility: Planned for family and professional visits, staff training, and admin expansion.



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
