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Overview	Established in 1891, Eastern State Hospital (ESH) is a 317 bed adult inpatient psychiatric hospital located in the City of Medical Lake, Washington.
	The hospital provides evaluations, competency restoration, and inpatient treatment for individuals with serious or long-term mental illness, from 20 counties in Eastern Washington referred through the Behavioral Health Organizations and/or the court system.
	Eastern State Hospital delivers evidence-based and effective inpatient treatment programs, interventions, and activities that promote patient recovery. Our therapeutic approach is designed to empower patients, instilling hope, support, self-discovery and independence.
Eligibility Requirements	Civil eligibility requirements – Individuals 18 years and older with a likelihood to commit serious harm to others or self, and/or grave disability due to a mental disorder are admitted through the court system via an involuntary civil commitment court order.
	Forensic eligibility requirements – Individuals 18 years and older require a court order through the criminal justice system to receive competency evaluation or restoration services up to 180 days. Individuals found "Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity" complete their sentence at the hospital while receiving treatment for their mental illness.
