	DBHR contracts with one Behavioral Health Organization and 11 community mental health providers who offer services to ORCSP participants. Each participant receives up to 60 months of support and treatment services at a reimbursed rate.	
Eligibility Requirements	Offenders are initially screened by DOC for meeting major mental disorder and dangerousness criteria. The offenders are then referred to the Statewide ORCSP Review Committee (co-chaired by DOC and DBHR ORCSP Administrators). The committee makes the final determination of designation into the ORCSP program and refers the offender to the appropriate Behavioral Health Organization or community mental health provider.
