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| Overview | Pregnant and Parenting Women Housing Support Services (PPW-HSS) provides housing support services for woman who are pregnant, postpartum, or parenting, and for their children, in drug and alcohol-free residences for up to 18 months. Housing Support Services are classified as support services rather than treatment. |
| Eligibility Requirements | Women who are: Pregnant, postpartum, or parenting (children age 17 and under) at the time they enter housing support services; Currently participating in outpatient treatment for substance use disorder or have completed residential or outpatient substance use disorder treatment within the last 12 months; Are at or below 220% of the Federal Poverty Level or on Medicaid at the time they enter transition housing; and Not actively involved in using alcohol and other drugs. |
| Authority | RCW 70.96A |
| Budget | The budget for this service is allocated by each individual Behavioral Health Organization (BHO) if they choose to fund this resource. |
| Rates | Determined by each BHO. |
| Costs/Numbers Served | Available from each BHO. |
| Partners | Housing Support case managers collaborate with residential and outpatient treatment providers, the courts and legal system, Division of Social and Health Services Case Workers, and housing advocates/providers. |
| Oversight | Each BHO provides oversight for the Housing Support Services provided in that region. |
