

Fact Sheet: State Prevention Plan

<p>Overview</p>	<p>The Prevention Policy Consortium (Consortium) was collaboratively developed in 2012 and implements the 5-year Washington State Prevention Strategic Plan. The Consortium, through partnerships, is working to strengthen and support an integrated statewide system of community-driven substance abuse prevention, mental health promotion and related issues.
