Recommendations start on page 37.</p> <p>The E2SHB 2439 Children's Mental Health Workgroup was tasked with reviewing challenges and barriers across three content areas: Assessment, Billing and Eligibility, Workforce, and Child Care and Education. In October 2016, recommendations from the sub workgroups were presented and voted on. A report to the Legislature is due December 1, 2016.</p> <p>DBHR is applying for a SAMHSA grant to expand SOC by adding services not currently in the state plan – to test effectiveness for possible addition to state plan. Possibilities are day treatment, therapeutic foster care and respite care. Due January 2017.</p> <p>HCA is launching a new pilot program, "PALS Plus". <b>SAT-ED (Substance Abuse Treatment – Enhancement and Dissemination) grant outcomes</b> Bridget Pavelle	Bridget summarized the findings from the now completed SAT-ED grant. There are many promising results; few that are statistically significant. Lin asked about the sustainability of the practices that made a difference. Kathy stated that sustainability is the focus of the SOC grant being written and is targeting children and youth with both behavioral health and co-occurring concerns.	<p><a href="#">link</a> to report</p>

Capacity challenges remain largely due to workforce issues. A foster care report was developed which uses many of the same outcomes measures. The next version (2017) of the "Measures" will be a comprehensive one with subpopulations reflected in the context of the larger document.
