WISE and SOC updates Andrea and Tina 10:15 – 10:30	<p>Topic Purpose – Information sharing.</p> <p>WISE implementation started June 2014. To date 1111 WISE screens have been done with 76 referrals to WISE and 739 youth receiving at least 1 WISE service. WISE will be available in all counties by June 2018. The WISE team is presenting at conferences across the state to get information into the communities and WISE Communication Sheets are in the process of being finalized.</p> <p>System of Care Team is planning 2 one day meetings on June 3 and June 4. June 3 focus is: “Partnering with Youth from Policy to Practice.” June 4 focus is “Looking Ahead: Planning for Meaningful Youth and Family Participation in Policy, Management and Services in the Context of WISE.” An invitation has been sent for the June 4 meeting to RSN Care Coordinators and FYSPRT leaders. <p>Executive Leadership Team</p> <p>Jane Beyer, Chris Imhoff, Michael Langer, Joe Avalos</p> <p>10:30 – 11:30</p>	<p>Topic Purpose – Information sharing.</p> <p>Executive Leadership Team (ELT) requested a report out on how things are going in the regions.</p> <p>Peninsula FYSPRT - reports having difficulty getting commitments from the RSNs and will be opening up an invitation to other system partners in the region. Meeting locations are rotating to different areas of the region.</p> <p>Southwest FYSPRT – Four local FYSPRTs are looking at how to network and expand with Behavioral Health Organizations (BHOs) and the separation of the counties.</p> <p>North Sound FYSPRT – reports difficulty getting commitments from professionals and providers.</p> <p>Northwest FYSPRT – reports it is slow going with tribes, high population of King County is a challenge. Reports substance use disorder representatives rotate frequently. Artwork from a regional activity is being displayed on King County buses.</p> <p>Northeast FYSPRT – RSN is supportive, challenging to engage providers and families from rural areas.</p> <p>From Legislative Session:</p> <p>Funding for TR is in the maintenance level budget. The following bills passed:</p> <p>HB 1879 – Directing the health care authority to issue a request for proposals for integrated managed health and behavioral health services for foster children. WISe will be in the managed care plan after October 2018.</p> <p>HB 1258 “Joel’s Law” - Family members can ask a judge to commit suicidal, dangerous relatives if a mental health professional will not involuntarily commit the relative.</p> <p>HB 1460 – Assisted outpatient treatment for those in jail waiting for a competency hearing and have a history of mental health hospitalization.</p> <p>The question was posed “How is the Statewide FYSPRT impacting funding and needs for tribal families?” “Is funding in bills specified to tribes?”</p> <p>Future of FYSPRTs:</p> <p>State level funding will be provided to BHOs/currently RSNs to fund the FYSPRTs.
