Client Rights HIPAA Mandatory Reporting

In this training we will cover the basic of client rights; HIPAA; the POLST form & Advance Directives. We will consider aspects of the various types and kinds of abuse, abandonment, neglect, and financial exploitation. We will discuss mandatory reporting and your responsibility as a mandatory reporter. We will explore the implications of HIPAA, and how this ties into our everyday interactions. We will gain an understanding of the types and risks of restraints and safer alternatives.
