## Quality Outcomes: Define; Explore; Apply

Foundational to any quality provider organization is the assurance of basic, fundamental, non-negotiable elements in service provision, but those elements do not necessarily equate to quality of life for individuals receiving services and supports. This training will provide a framework for how to think about, plan for, implement, and measure those basic, fundamental, non-negotiable elements in service provision in a manner that improves quality of life outcomes. The day provides an opportunity to define, explore and apply concepts of quality, shared values, and basic assurances as they relate to services and supports. Activities allow participants to gain insight and skills utilizing appreciative inquiry, self-assessment processes, and action plans.
