Dual Diagnosis: Mental Health Disorders in clients with Developmental Disabilities

Attendees will better understand, treat, and support clients with some of the more common Mental Health Disorders: Depression, Bipolar Disorder, Psychosis, Anxiety/PTSD, and Personality Disorders.

Attendees will receive a brief overview of these diagnoses, which includes the symptomology associated with these diagnoses and the clarification on disorders frequently attributed incorrectly to the diagnosis of intellectual/developmental disability. Participants will receive information on signs of possible undiagnosed mental health disorders they should be aware of as they provide services and supports to individuals diagnosed with intellectual/developmental disability. They will also receive further instruction on supports and strategies used in supporting individuals who are receiving services in a community setting.
