CIIBS Waiver Information Sheet for Families

The **Children’s Intensive In-home Behavioral Support (CIIBS) Waiver** offers support to children between ages 8 through 20 years old living with their family and who are assessed at high or severe risk of out-of-home placement due to challenging behaviors. The CIIBS program design relies on the shared responsibility of the individual’s parent and offers services to support the individual effectively to prevent out-of-home placement.

Service Limits	CIIBS Waiver Services
<p>Determined by the Individual Support Plan (ISP). Average cost of service, including personal care and respite, is \$4000 per month per client.</p>	<p>All individuals will receive:</p> <p>Behavior Support and Consultation Programs designed to support individuals to behave in ways that enhance their inclusion in the community, including direct interventions to decrease challenging behaviors which compromise the person’s ability to remain in the community.</p> <p>Staff/Family Consultation & Training Professional training and consultation to families and direct service providers to better meet the needs of the person.</p> <p>Additional services include:</p> <p>Assistive Technology Purchase of items, equipment or product systems used to increase, maintain or improve individuals’ functional capabilities.</p> <p>Environmental Accessibility Adaptations Physical adaptations to the home required for the person to continue living in the community.</p> <p>Extended State Plan Services Services beyond the limits of the Medicaid State Plan for occupational, physical, speech, and language therapies.</p> <p>Nurse Delegation Training and nursing management for nursing assistants who perform delegated nursing tasks.</p> <p>Sexual Deviancy Evaluation Professional evaluations that assess the person's needs and the person's level of risk of sexual offending or sexual recidivism; determine the need for psychological, medical or therapeutic services; and provide treatment recommendations to mitigate any assessed risk.</p> <p>Specialized Clothing Nonrestrictive clothing adapted to the individual needs and related to their disability.</p> <p>Specialized Nutrition Assessment, intervention and monitoring services from a certified dietician.</p>

Service Limits	CIIBS Waiver Services
	<p>Specially prepared food or purchases of particular types of food, needed to sustain the individual in the family home.</p> <p>Specialized Psychiatric Services Psychiatric services specific to the needs of the individual with a developmental disability.</p> <p>Therapeutic Equipment and Supplies Equipment and supplies that are incorporated in a behavioral support or therapeutic plan, designed by an appropriate professional.</p> <p>Transportation Reimbursement to a provider for non-medical transportation required to access waiver services specified in the Individual Support Plan (ISP).</p> <p>Vehicle Modifications Adaptations or alterations to a vehicle required in order to accommodate the unique needs of the individual, enable full integration into the community and ensure the health, welfare, and safety of the individual and/or family members.</p>
Limits determined by the DDA Assessment; costs included in the \$4000/month average	<p>Respite Care Short term relief to individuals caring for a person with a developmental disability.</p>
Limits determined by the DDA Assessment; costs included in the \$4000/month average	<p>Personal Care Provision of assistance with activities of daily living (ADLs).</p>
