Changes to the Able Bodied **Adults Without** Dependents or **ABAWD Rules**



Effective July 1, 2023, anyone who receives Basic Food benefits and:

- Lives in KING or SNOHOMISH Counties (with the exception of those residing on the Muckleshoot or Tulalip Reservations);
- Is between the ages of 18-49 years old;
- Does not live with a child under 18 years old; and
- Is able to work

May be required to meet ABAWD work requirements, such as working 20 hours per week or participating in specific work activities, to remain eligible for Basic Food benefits for more than three months. For more information, see www.dshs.wa.gov/abawd.
