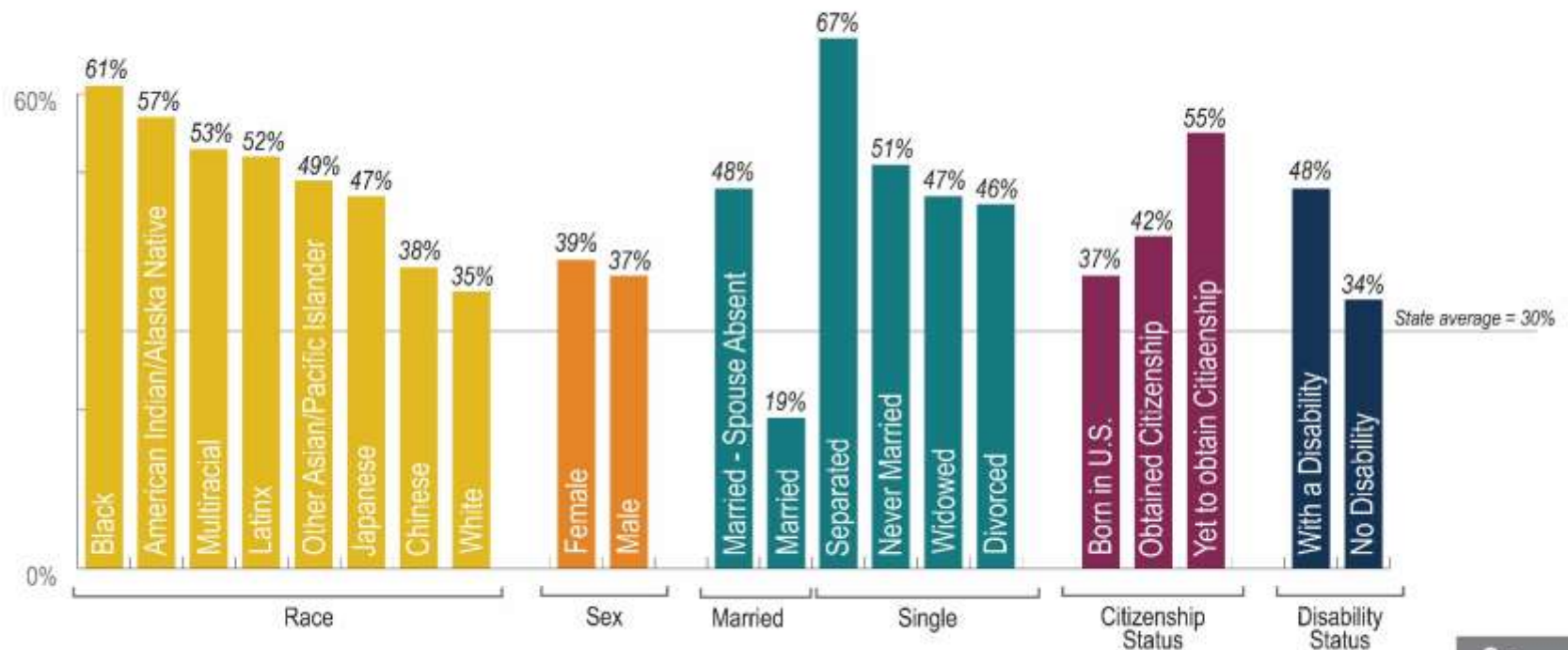


WHO IS MORE LIKELY TO EXPERIENCE POVERTY IN SPOKANE COUNTY?

On average, 30 percent of people living in Washington state are struggling to make ends meet. Spokane's average is higher, and a person's likelihood of experiencing poverty is influenced by many factors, including race, sex, relationship status, citizenship, and disability status.

HOW HAS CHILD POVERTY CHANGED IN SPOKANE?

Poverty is highest among children as they transition to adulthood (18 to 24), and in the early years before they enter kindergarten (birth to five). Poverty rates remain higher than pre-recession levels for children in every age group.

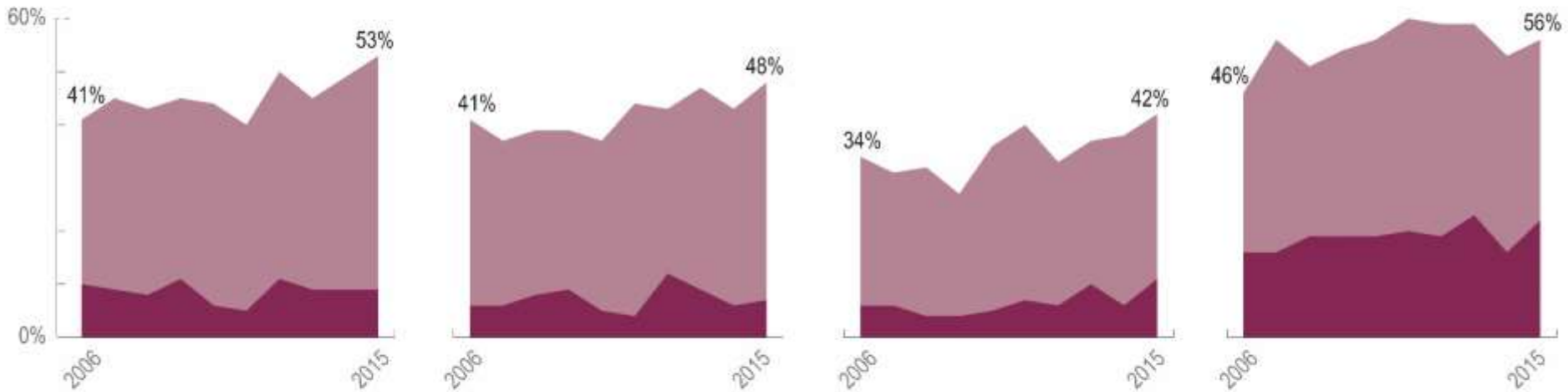
Percentage Of Children Living Below 200% Of Federal Poverty Level By Age Group
