Executive Order: Reducing Poverty in America by Promoting Opportunity and Economic Mobility (April 10, 2018)

"The Federal Government's role is to clear paths to selfsufficiency, reserving public assistance programs for those who are truly in need. The Federal Government should do everything within its authority to empower individuals by providing opportunities for work, including by investing in Federal programs that are effective at moving people into the workforce and out of poverty."


• Requires USDA to review SNAP rules, policies, and administrative processes that align with Federal law but support State flexibility, strengthen work requirements, address barriers to work, and promote program integrity.

<u>2018 Farm Bill</u>

- House Bill H.R. 2
 - Passed by Agriculture Committee on April 18th
 - Changes work requirements 20 hours of work or a work program for all adults (ages 18-59) with dependents over 6; increases to 25 hours per week in 2026
 - Requires mandatory E&T
 - Changes E&T services States must include case management and assessments; eliminates independent job search and workfare).
 - Increases 100% funding for E&T to \$1B; eliminates pledge State funding
- Senate Bill TBD

Approved and Pending Section 1115 Medicaid Waivers, as of May 8, 2018





Key FNS Investments




Program Growth

SNAP E&T DATA Grants




- **GOAL**: To develop data driven, effective and efficient SNAP E&T programs that have improved employment and earnings outcomes for program participants.
- First round of data grants = about \$6 million to 8 States.
- Purpose of the grants is to support the development of State SNAP E&T data collection and reporting systems
- Funds are to be used for: 1) training and capacity building; 2) IT systems development; and/or 3) continuous program improvement.

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
- GOAL: To increase the capacity of States to operate effective E&T programs that connect SNAP participants to skills training and goodpaying jobs using thirdparty partnerships.
- First ever large-scale technical assistance project to support growth in SNAP E&T.
- Project funded by FNS, operated by the Seattle Jobs Initiative.


States Receiving Intensive TA



SNAP E&T Learning Academy (2017 & 2018)

- GOAL: Provide participants the specific technical expertise on SNAP E&T they need to work within their State or across multiple States to build high-quality, employer-driven SNAP E&T programs with an emphasis on 50 percent reimbursement program.
- About 35-40 participants from across SNAP E&T stakeholder community (competitively selected).
- Participants complete projects that are actionable, specific, measurable, and discrete; generalizable and scalable; and focused on 50-50 funding.


