SCHEDULE OF CASH MEDICAL SUPPORT OBLIGATIONS

The following schedule of cash medical support obligations shall be used by all courts and child support enforcement agencies to calculate the amount of cash medical support to be paid by an obligor, unless the annual gross income of the obligor is below 150% of the federal poverty level.

The schedule of cash medical support obligations is based on data published by the United States Department of Agriculture: Expenditures on Children by Families 2012, Estimated annual expenditures on a child by husband-wife families, urban Midwest, 12 and the lowest regional capitation rate of Ohio's Medicaid managed care program, as determined by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.
