- Noncustodial Parent or Employer can access this site to make payments.
- Custodial Parent or Noncustodial Parent can view recent payment history.

Public Assistance or Not?

The state **must** sign off on a child support order if the child/children receive or have received public assistance. Parties can use the [Declaration Regarding Public Assistance](#) to advise the court of their status.

Income Information

Parties can use the [Request for Income Information for Purposes of Entering a Child Support Order](#), (DSHS 18-701), to request the other party's income information. If the parties do not already have a case with DCS, the party can request “locate services” for the purpose of obtaining income information:

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
