EBT Update





What is happening?

• DSHS is changing its EBT service provider.

Why is the change necessary?

- DSHS' current EBT service provider, JPMorgan Chase, announced in November 2013 its decision to stop providing EBT services nationally.
- Based on JPMorgan Chase's announcement, DSHS began a competitive procurement process, selecting Fidelity Information Services (FIS) as its new EBT service provider.

When is the change happening?

- EBT services will be transferred from JPMorgan Chase to FIS overnight between Saturday, July 16 and Sunday, July 17, 2016.
- The service transfer window begins at approximately 10 p.m. Saturday and is expected to be completed by 8 a.m. Sunday.
- DSHS scheduled the service transfer window to minimize the impact to cardholders, merchants and financial institutions.
- DSHS sent letters to EBT cardholders in late June informing them of the service change.

What will occur during the service transfer window?

- The entire EBT system will be turned off during the service transfer window. This means no food or cash transactions can be made during this time.
- EBT households are urged to plan ahead regarding their food and cash needs during the window.

Will there be noticeable changes after the service transfer window ends?

- Cardholders, merchants and financial institutions will not notice any differences in how transactions are made, communicated or settled.
- All existing EBT cards will continue to work. There is no need to obtain replacement cards.
