## Procedures

# A. What if I need to modify a support order on a case with tribal connections?

- 1. Consult the Tribal Liaison or Tribal Claims Officer if:
  - a. Tribal jurisdictional issues are involved, or
  - b. The order is a tribal order.
- Refer the case to the Tribal Liaison or Tribal Claims Officer for possible referral to a tribal IV-D program that may be involved, or to a tribal court for modification if any party to an order (administrative, superior court or tribal court) lives on a reservation.
- 3. See Section 13.035 for correcting an inaccurate administrative default order.
- B. When do I modify an order to include medical insurance?

- 1. Modify the order for medical support if **both** of the following apply:
  - a. The order does not address health insurance.
  - b. Indian Health Services (IHS) is not available to the children through the NCP or the CP.
