## **Procedures**

## A. What is the purpose of the Nez Perce agreement?

- 1. The agreement establishes a process for the Division of Child Support (DCS) to file certain paternity, establishment, enforcement and modification cases, and have these cases adjudicated by the Nez Perce tribal court, according to the Tribe's laws and customs.
- 2. The agreement also establishes a process for the reciprocal granting of full faith and credit and enforcement of certain child support orders and judgments.

## B. When is a case included under the Nez Perce agreement?

- A case is included under the agreement when the noncustodial parent (NCP):
  - a. Lives on the Nez Perce reservation,
  - b. Is employed by the Tribe, Tribal enterprise, or Indianowned business located on the reservation, **or**
  - c. Is otherwise subject to the jurisdiction of the tribal court under the laws of the Nez Perce Tribe.

## C. How do I identify a Nez Perce case?

- You may discover a Nez Perce case by one of the following:
  - a. Normal case review.

- b. Telephone calls from an NCP, custodial parent (CP), or the Tribe.
- c. Reviewing new referrals.

# D. What actions do I take once a case is identified as a being a Nez Perce case?

- 1. Post a case comment **CC** code 76 indicating that the case is included under the Nez Perce Child Support Agreement.
- 2. Consult with the Spokane field office Tribal Liaison before you transfer the case to the Spokane field office.
  - Spokane Tribal Unit staff will review the case to determine any necessary action.
- 3. You may call the Spokane field office Tribal Liaison if you have any questions.
