Summary

The Community Services Division (CSD) is updating the exclusion information for Title IV education assistance college work study earnings under the Clarifying Information. CSD is not changing the rule as it is still correct.

Since the Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership (LEAP) program and Special Leveraging Educational Assistance Partnership (SLEAP) have been eliminated, state work study (SWS) earnings (wages) no longer fall under Title IV funding and must now be counted as earned income for SWS students. This change clarifies the rule and at the same time If state work study ever gets all or partial Title IV funding back, it avoids having to change the actual rule again for this purpose.
