This section contains information about cash assistance need and payment standards, eligibility standards based on income, and standards for ongoing additional requirements.

Clarifying Information - WAC 388-478-0005

DSHS is required by state law [<u>RCW 74.04.770</u>] to establish, on an annual basis, standards of need for cash assistance programs. These standards are based on studies of actual living costs for basic requirements. They may vary by program and family size.

Payment standards are based on assistance unit size and are used to determine eligibility and benefit levels for cash assistance.

The percentage difference between the need and payment standard for an assistance unit is called the ratable reduction. Starting July 1, 2012, the grant payment cannot exceed the payment standard for a family of eight listed in WAC 388 478 0020.

Clarifying Information - WAC 388-478-0006

Defines the types of medical facilities or institutions where the CPI payment standard is used for TANF, SFA, PWA, ABD cash, and RCA while a person is a resident. For TANF/SFA, refer to <u>WAC 388-454-0015</u> to determine if temporary absence rules apply and if CPI is appropriate.
