5.1.9 What are the participation requirements during the third trimester?

The third trimester of pregnancy starts 90 days before the estimated due date.- For example, if the estimated due date is 7/14, the third trimester starts on 4/15.- Please use the Defining 3rd Trimester Tip Sheet to determine the start date of the third trimester.

In the third trimester of pregnancy, participation for the pregnant <u>woman participant</u> is based upon the results of the full comprehensive assessment and the <u>parent participant</u> may:

- •Be required to participate up to 20 hours per week if the comprehensive evaluation, or an assessment, indicates a need for mental health and/or alcohol or drug treatment (unless medical evidence indicates that the-parent-participant is not able to participate in any activity), or
- •In<u>t</u> Parental Education_-Project pilot sites only, be required to participate up to 20 hours per week in parental education if the comprehensive evaluation or specialized pilot site assessment indicates a need for parental education or parent skills training, or
- Participate in the WorkFirst program on a voluntary basis, if there are no identified mental health and/or chemical dependency issues, or
- •Choose to not not to participate in WorkFirst activities until delivery date, if there are no identified mental health and/or chemical dependency issues.

<u>Note: In order to remain eligible for benefits all All</u> pregnant minor <u>recipients participants</u> must be actively participating in high school diploma or equivalency <u>certificate</u>-completion programs <u>to remain eligible for benefits</u>, <u>and are</u>, therefore, <u>they are</u> not eligible to take the 3rd trimester exemption (see WAC 388-486-0010.)

If a mental health or chemical dependency professional indicates that a <u>parent_participant</u> should do more than 20 hours per week of treatment, we should encourage <u>the parentthem</u> to participate in the number of hours recommended; however, we can only require 20 hours per week of participation. If <u>she they</u> refuses to participate in required available treatment, follow the good cause process.- Indicate the appropriate participation status on the "Component/IRP Information Screen" by selecting if the <u>parent participant</u> is:

- •Required to participate in mental health and/or chemical dependency treatment;
- •Required to participate in parental education or parent skills training in Parental Education Project pilot and Home Visiting, if assessed by a WFSSS as needing further support due to multiple barriers, or needs.

•Volunteering to participate in mental health and/or chemical dependency treatment; or
•Exempt from participating.
