5.2.10 When it is appropriate to code "JT" in eJAS?

ESL service is provided for <u>participants parents</u>-with ESL levels 1-6 to assist <u>in them to</u>-gain<u>ing</u> language skills necessary to obtain and maintain employment. CASAS and ORIA approved assessment tools are used to determine a <u>parent's participant's ESL</u> level and language skill gains, as defined by the Washington State Board of Community and Technical Colleges (SBCTC).

- Use the **JT** eJAS component code for ESL that is when stacked with 20 hours of core activities and indicate in the parent's participant's Individual Responsibility Plan (IRP) that ESL is a skill needed for employment.
- <u>Use the ES eJAS component code for a stand-alone ESL that is not stacked with a core activity. ESL instruction may also be provided as a stand-alone activity</u> until the parent's participant's English proficiency is sufficient to participate in core activities. Use the ES eJAS component code for ESL that is not stacked with a core activity.
