

5.2.10 When it is appropriate to code “JT” in eJAS?

ESL service is provided for ~~participants parents~~ with ESL levels 1-6 to assist ~~in them to~~ gaining language skills necessary to obtain and maintain employment. CASAS and ORIA approved assessment tools are used to determine a ~~parent’s~~ participant’s ESL level and language skill gains, as defined by the Washington State Board of Community and Technical Colleges (SBCTC).

- Use the **JT** eJAS component code for ESL ~~that is~~when stacked with 20 hours of core activities and indicate in the ~~parent’s~~ participant’s Individual Responsibility Plan (IRP) that ESL is a skill needed for employment.
- Use the **ES** eJAS component code for a stand-alone ESL that is not stacked with a core activity. ~~ESL instruction may also be provided as a stand-alone activity~~ until the ~~parent’s~~ participant’s English proficiency is sufficient to participate in core activities. ~~Use the ES eJAS component code for ESL that is not stacked with a core activity.~~
