
Washington Health and Human Services Enterprise Coalition



Executive Sponsor Committee

STRATEGIC FOCUS

Provides the mechanism by which HHS Coalition technology investments are vetted, approved, prioritized and monitored by providing strategic insight, crossorganizational project support, and federal funding guidance. G2

Enterprise Steering Committee

OPERATIONAL FOCUS

Ensures business alignment and provides operational direction for HHS Coalition technology projects and governance processes in support of the Executive Sponsor Committee.

Integrated Enterprise Project Group

TACTICAL FOCUS

Supports cross-agency collaboration on IT project ideas and coordinates with HHS Coalition workgroups.

EPMO

Enterprise Project Management Office

SUPPORT TEAM

Supports the governance committee operations and oversight of IT projects. The team supports communications and continuity across the governance model.

Criteria for Determining HHS Coalition Projects

Either of these criteria are met



Impact on shared business outcomes for 2+ organizations



Maximizes federal funding available to the state

All three of these criteria are met



Creates capability for future system integration or reuse



Decreases risk of failure or service disruption for mission critical systems



Opportunity for cost savings/ efficiencies or impact to cost allocations for 2+ organizations

HHS Coalition Oversight Process



Identifying Potential IT Projects for the HHS Coalition

Organization reviews guidelines for determining project's inclusion into HHS Coalition portfolio.



HHS Coalition Project Initiation (Permission to Plan)

Collaborate with other partner organizations, defining business needs, and considering reuse within HHS Coalition.



HHS Coalition Project Planning (Permission to Implement)

Perform a formal review of organization's project plan ensuring implementation thoroughness.



HHS Coalition Project Monitoring

HHS Coalition reviews/monitors performance of HHS Coalition project portfolio.



HHS Coalition Project Close-out

HHS Coalition memorializes project successes/challenges within the project portfolio.
