## HOW IT WORKS:

AJAC is offering a hybrid bootcamp experience where students can learn about apprenticeship training opportunities and careers in advanced manufacturing. The bootcamp prepares students for next step AJAC training programs at participating high schools and beyond.

The bootcamp will be offered July 12-16<sup>th</sup>.

The bootcamp is the first of a three step process for high school students to engage in AJAC apprenticeship opportunities.



### STEP 1 BOOTCAMP

- 30 Hours of live lecture and in-person learning
- Understand the manufacturing industry and employment prep
- Earn industry certifications and COVID safety protocols



### STEP 2 AJAC CLASSES

- 3 AJAC classes starting fall 2021
  - Check-in after fall quarter
  - Includes company tours, job shadowing, and networking with industry mentors

### STEP 3 APPRENTICESHIP

- Interview with AJAC's partnering employers
- Complete all 3 AJAC classes
- Complete 2,000 hours of paid on-the-job training
- Earn Journey-Level Credential
